

# AD FESI REQUEST CONCERNING IMPORTS OF FERRO-SILICON ORIGINATING IN THE PR CHINA AND RUSSIA

### 1. Product description and uses

The product concerned is a Ferro-alloy defined according to the nomenclature (i.e. tariff headings 72 02 21 and 72 02 29).

It is produced in electric arc furnaces by means of reducing quartz by various carbon bearing products. It is sold in the form of lumps, grains or powder. Internationally-recognised specifications exist for various qualities on the basis of the impurity content: iron, aluminium, calcium.

Almost all the production is used for the production of steels (75%) and foundries (about 20%; other uses about 5%). The alloying element is silicon, which is either introduced into steels which require it as an alloying element or used for steel deoxidation by the iron and steel industry.

There are two main products. Ferro-silicon 75% with a silicon content of 75% and Ferro-silicon 65% with 65% silicon. Other qualities are Ferro-silicon 45% and Ferro-silicon 15%. The latter two products are imported under Heading 72 02 29 and are much smaller in terms of volume. Ferro-silicon 75% and Ferro-silicon 65% are imported under heading 72 02 21 and constitute the bulk of imports.

EU producers produce essentially Ferro-silicon 75%. This product constitutes almost 95% of total EU production. Exceptionally EU producers will produce some Ferro-silicon 65%, when they have difficulties in the furnace during the production process, but this remains by far the exception.

The same is the case for the imports from the two countries concerned.

However, for the sake of all calculations, adjustments were introduced in relation to imports falling under CN 72 02 29 to ensure calculations are all performed on a 75% Si basis.

## 2. Summary of the complaint

EUROALLIAGES (the "Complainant"), on behalf of Union producers of Ferro-silicon ("FeSi"), requests that the European Commission ("Commission") extends the antidumping duty pursuant to article 11(2) of Council regulation (EC) no 1225/2009 concerning imports of Ferro-silicon from the People's Republic of China ("the PR China") and Russia, with a view to extend the AD measures for a five-year period.

The existing measures have been imposed by Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) no 360/2014 of 9 April 2014 imposing a definitive anti-dumping duty on imports of Ferro-silicon originating in the PR China and Russia.

Russia and the PR China are both a serious threat in terms of volume: neither the evolution of the Russian and Chinese domestic consumption nor the available forecasts as regards their exports policy can lead to reasonably believe that the EU market will not be targeted should the AD measure be allowed to lapse.

Furthermore, the saturation of other markets, the existence of huge and idle capacities in both markets, the increased competition on non-EU markets with new players (Malaysia, the expected new Kazakh facility...), the measures taken by the US against Chinese exports and the likely removal of the Chinese export tax are further incentives to increase their penetration of the EU market in the absence of AD measures.

Regarding Russian and Chinese pricing policy, the available information regarding prices in other export markets show a recurrent trend to export at dumped conditions. As regards the PR China in particular, the likely removal of the export tax will substantially decrease their – already - low level of export prices. This mere fact, combined with recurrent and substantial overcapacities, all the more support the likelihood of continuation of dumping in the absence of AD measures.

The combination of expected increased exports of Russian and Chinese Ferro-silicon into the EU at dumped prices shall generate material injury to the Union industry in the absence of measures.
